

Pentecost 10, August 1, 2021, **Order of Worship**

Announcements, Concerns, Joys

Call to Worship, Psalm 78:23-29 (pew Bible p. 916) Psalm 78 as a whole repeats the holy history of the years between the Exodus and the time when King David began his rule on Mt. Zion. God's faithfulness over against the ongoing rebellion of the chosen people is the theme of the day, heard again in the reading from Exodus and in the gospel. We read responsively:

***Confession and Forgiveness** (from *Sundays & Seasons*, 2020 Augsburg Fortress, p. 198)

P: Blessed be the holy Trinity, one God, the God of manna, the God of miracles, the God of mercy. **Amen.**

Drawn to Christ and seeking God's abundance, let us confess our sin: God, our provider, **help us. It is hard to believe there is enough to share. We question your ways when they differ from the ways of the world in which we live. We turn to our own understanding rather than trusting in you. We take offense at your teachings and your ways. Turn us again to you. Where else can we turn? Share with us the words of eternal life and feed us for life in the world. Amen.**

Beloved people of God, *in* Jesus, the manna from heaven, you are fed and nourished. *By* Jesus, the worker of miracles, there is always more than enough. *Through* Jesus, the bread of life, you are shown God's mercy: you are forgiven and loved into abundant life. **Amen.**

A reading from Exodus, the 16th chapter (16:2-4, 9-15) pew Bible, p. 112

A food crisis becomes a faith crisis for the Israelites in the wilderness. The hungry people forget God's saving work in the exodus, and they wish for the food they had in Egypt. Nevertheless, God miraculously meets their needs, with manna for bread and quail for meat. (*Sundays & Seasons*, 2020, p. 233, Augsburg Fortress).

A reading from Ephesians, the 4th chapter (1-16) pew Bible, p. 1821

Christians share fundamental unity and diversity. Our unity consists in the one body, one Spirit, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and one God. Our diversity is expressed in various forms of ministry whose goal is equipping the saints and building up Christ's one body (*Sundays & Seasons*, 2020, p. 233, Augsburg Fortress).
