<u>Call to Worship (Psalm 50:1-6)</u> The Mighty One, God, the Lord, speaks and summons the earth from the rising of the sun to the place where it sets. From Zion, perfect in beauty, God shines forth. Our God comes and will not be silent; a fire devours before him, and around him a tempest rages. <u>A reading from 2nd Corinthians, the 4th chapter (4:3-6)</u> The spotlight of Christian ministry is not on the people who carry out our Lord's work, but on Jesus Christ. Just as God made light shine at creation, God makes the Light of Jesus Christ shine in our lives through Christian ministry (*Sundays & Seasons*, 2020, p. 91). *See the light! See the glory!*

Paul writes, Even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the <u>light</u> of the gospel of the <u>glory</u> of Christ, who is the image of God. For we do not preach ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. For God, who said, "Let <u>light shine</u> out of darkness," made his <u>light shine</u> in our hearts to give us the <u>light</u> of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ.
