<u>Greeting</u> In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

<u>Call to Worship—Psalm 25:1-10</u> Can you put yourself in this psalm? Let the words of the author become *your* words as you practice trusting in God and paying attention to him.

To you, O Lord, I lift up my soul; in you I trust, O my God. Do not let me be put to shame [when I pray this, I add "before you" here], nor let my enemies triumph over me. No one whose hope is in you will ever be put to shame, but those who are treacherous without excuse will be put to shame. Show me your ways, O Lord, teach me your paths; guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Savior, and my hope is in you all day long. Remember, O Lord, your great mercy and love, for they are from of old. Remember not the sins of my youth and my rebellious ways; according to your love remember me, for you are good, O Lord. Good and upright is the Lord; therefore he instructs sinners in his ways. He guides the humble in what is right and teaches them his way. All the ways of the Lord are loving and faithful for those who keep the demands of his covenant.

Confession and Forgiveness for Lent (from Sundays & Seasons, 2020, Augsburg Fortress, p. 100)

God hears us when we cry, and draws us close in Jesus Christ. Let us return to the one who is full of compassion. Fountain of living water, **pour out your mercy over us. <u>A reading from Genesis, the 9th chapter (9:8-17)</u> Today's reading is the conclusion to the flood story. Because of human sin, God destroys the earth by flood, saving only Noah, his family, and the animals on the ark. Yet divine destruction gives way to divine commitment. As in the first creation, God blesses humanity and establishes a covenant with all creatures. -- Notice that the word *covenant* is used 7 times. Pay attention to how committed God is to us!

Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him: "I now establish my <u>covenant</u> with you and with your descendants after you and with every living creature that was with you—the birds, the livestock and all the wild animals, all those that came out of the ark with you—every living creature on earth. I establish my <u>covenant</u> with you: Never again will all life be cut off by the waters of a flood; never again will there be a flood to destroy the earth."

And God said, "This is the sign of the <u>covenant</u> I am making between me and you and every living creature with you, a <u>covenant</u> for all generations to come: I have set my rainbow in the clouds, and it will be the sign of the <u>covenant</u> between me and the earth. Whenever I bring clouds over the earth and the rainbow appears in the clouds, I will remember my <u>covenant</u> between me and you and all living creatures of every kind. Never again will the waters become a flood to destroy all life. Whenever the rainbow appears in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting <u>covenant</u> between God and all living creatures of every kind on the earth." So God said to Noah, "This is the sign of the <u>covenant</u> I have established between me and all life on the earth."

<u>Return to the Lord</u> your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and abounding in steadfast love.
