Call to Worship, Psalm 85:8-13 (read responsively)

P: I will listen to what God the Lord will say; he promises peace to his people, his saints—but let them not return to folly.

C: Surely his salvation is near those who fear him, so that his glory may dwell in our land.

P: Love and faithfulness meet together; righteousness and peace kiss each other.

C: Faithfulness springs forth from the earth, and righteousness looks down from heaven.

P: The Lord will indeed give what is good, and our land will yield its harvest.

C: Righteousness goes before him and prepares the way for his steps.

***Confession and Forgiveness** (from *Sundays & Seasons*, 2020 Augsburg Fortress, p. 198)

P: Blessed be the holy Trinity, one God, the God of manna, the God of miracles, the God of mercy. **Amen.**

Drawn to Christ and seeking God's abundance, let us confess our sin: God, our provider, **help us. It is hard to believe there is enough to share. We question your ways when they differ from the ways of the world in which we live. We turn to our own understanding rather than trusting in you. We take offense at your teachings and your ways. God's word of judgment through Amos conflicts with the king's court prophet Amaziah, whom Amos encounters at Bethel (from *Sundays & Seasons*, 2020, p. 223, Augsburg Fortress).
