*Confession and Forgiveness (from Sundays & Seasons, 2020 Augsburg Fortress, p. 198)

<u>A reading from Job, the 38th chapter (38:1-11)</u> At the end of the book of Job, after Job and his companions have argued about the cause of the great suffering Job endures, God finally speaks. These verses begin that speech, which is a grand vision of creation, describing God's ordering of the cosmos and inviting Job to marvel at its beauty. (*Sundays & Seasons*, 2020, p. 212, Augsburg Fortress). [After each reading the response is, "The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God!**]

<u>A reading from 2nd Corinthians, the sixth chapter (6:1-13)</u> Paul and his fellow workers experience great hardships and even rejection while carrying out their missionary work. Nevertheless, Paul continuously proclaims that God has not rejected his people but is graciously working for our salvation (*Sundays & Seasons*, 2020, p. 212, Augsburg Fortress).

*Alleluia! Alleluia! Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. Alleluia!

*Gospel Mark 4:35-41 By calming the storm on the sea, Jesus reveals his power over evil, since the sea represents evil and chaos. (In the beginning, in Genesis, our God brings "chaos," which is water raging out of control, under his submission.) The boat on the sea is a symbol of the church and invites us to trust God amid life's turbulence (Sundays & Seasons, 2020, p. 212, Augsburg Fortress). Before the gospel: Glory to you, O Lord!

After the gospel: Praise to you, O Christ!
