Be silent before the Sovereign Lord, for the day of the Lord is near. The Lord has prepared a sacrifice; he has consecrated those he has invited. At that time I will search Jerusalem with lamps and punish those who are complacent, who are like wine left on its dregs, who think, "The Lord will do nothing, either good or bad." Their wealth will be plundered, their houses demolished. They will build houses but not live in them; they will plant vineyards but not drink the wine. The great day of the Lord is near—near and coming quickly.

Listen! The cry on the day of the Lord will be bitter, the shouting of the warrior there. That day will be a day of wrath, of distress and anguish, trouble and ruin, darkness and gloom, clouds and blackness, trumpet and battle cry against the fortified cities. I will bring distress on the people and they will walk like blind men, because they have sinned against the Lord. Their blood will be poured out like dust. Their silver, their gold will not be able to save them on the day of the Lord's wrath. In the fire of his jealousy the whole world will be consumed, for he will make a sudden end of all who live in the earth. Word of God, word of life.

Alleluia Alleluia! Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. Alleluia!
