Greeting In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Call to Worship Psalm 46 (Martin Luther's favorite Psalm) God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult. The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge. There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High. God is in the midst of the city; it shall not be moved; God will help it when the morning dawns. The nations are in an uproar, the kingdoms totter; he lifts his voice, the earth melts. The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge. Come, behold the works of the Lord; see what desolations he has brought on the earth. He makes wars cease to the end of the earth; he breaks the bow, and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire. "Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations, I am exalted in the earth." The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.

<u>Reflection on Psalm 46</u>: God, our Lord, is our very present help in trouble. In this time of physical distancing, surrounded by the pandemic, racial protests, riots, political turmoil—in the midst of all this, God, our Lord, is still our very present help in trouble. "Be still, and know that I am God!"

Confession and Forgiveness

P: Let us confess our sin in the presence of God (and of one another):

C: Faithful God, have mercy on us. We confess that we are captive to sin and cannot free ourselves. We turn from your loving embrace and go our own ways. We pass judgment on one another before examining ourselves. We place our own needs before those of our neighbors. We keep your gift of salvation to ourselves. Make us humble, cast away our transgressions, and turn us again to life in you through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

P: God hears the cries of all who call out in need, and through his death and resurrection, Christ has made us his own. Hear the truth that God proclaims: Your sins are forgiven in the name of Jesus Christ! Led by the Holy Spirit, live now in freedom to do God's work in the world. **Amen**.

<u>A reading from Leviticus, the 19th chapter (19:1-2, 15-18)</u> Note: Leviticus, the 3rd book of the Hebrew scriptures, is the source of most of the 613 laws, commandments, statutes, and ordinances which determined Jewish life in Bible times.

The Lord said to Moses, "Speak to the entire assembly of Israel and say to them: "Be holy because I, the Lord your God, am holy. . . . Do not pervert justice; do not show partiality to the poor or favoritism to the great, but judge your neighbor fairly. Do not go about spreading slander among your people. Do not do anything that endangers your neighbor's life. I am the Lord. Do not hate a fellow Israelite in your heart. Rebuke your neighbor frankly so you will not share in their guilt. Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against anyone among your people, but love your neighbor as yourself. I am the Lord." Word of God, word of life.
