

Pentecost 14, September 6, 2020

Greeting In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Call to Worship (8 verses with 5 different words for God's guidance)

Psalm 119:33-40 Teach me, O Lord, the way of your **statutes**, and I will observe it to the end. Give me understanding, that I may keep your **law** and observe it with my whole heart. Lead me in the path of your **commandments**, for I delight in it. Turn my heart to your **decrees**, and not to selfish gain. Turn my eyes from looking at worthless things; preserve my life according to your word. Confirm to your servant your promise, which is for those who fear you. Turn away the disgrace that I dread, for your **ordinances** are good. See, I have longed for your **precepts**; in your righteousness preserve my life. Amen.

Confession and Forgiveness

P: Let us pray: Merciful God, all hearts and desires are known to you, and we have no secrets before you. Turn us from our sin through the power of your Holy Spirit, so that we may be attentive to your word and your promise, through Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord. Amen.

P: With masked voices, let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another:

C: Faithful God, have mercy on us. We confess that we are captive to sin and cannot free ourselves. We turn from your loving embrace and go our own ways. We pass judgment on one another before examining ourselves. We place our own needs before those of our neighbors. We keep your gift of salvation to ourselves. Make us humble, cast away our transgressions, and turn us again to life in you through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

P: God hears the cries of all who call out in need, and through his death and resurrection, Christ has made us his own. Hear the truth that God proclaims: Your sins are forgiven in the name of Jesus Christ! Led by the Holy spirit, live now in freedom to do God's work in the world. **Amen.**
