Parade ends at Stark's Floral with Santa and Mrs. Claus with treats. A donation of non-perishable items to the Circle of Joy is appreciated.



Reflections from Rose

Here we are in November already. Thoughts of *Thanksgiving* begin to fill our minds. I was spending some quiet time with the Lord the other morning, using my devotional book to get started. It directed me to read in the book of Numbers chapter 11: 1-11

As chapter 11 opens, the Israelites are complaining about their hardships as they are traveling through the desert on their journey to the promised land. Maybe you know the story...God was miraculously feeding them with Manna (bread from heaven) that came down when the dew settled on the camp at night. The trouble was they began to crave OTHER food, and they started wailing, "If only we had meat to eat!" They looked back and remembered the fish, cucumbers, melons, leeks, onions, and garlic they used to have to eat in Egypt. (Pastor Gail would never wail for garlic, she doesn't really like it!)

It got me to thinking though, how longing for *different circumstances* can lead me to complain sometimes. This kind of thinking can even lead me to becoming very self-centered, obsessed with what I want, what I'm sure I NEED! Instead of rejoicing over God's faithful and loving care, I sometimes feel I need something MORE, something BETTER, something DIFFERENT.

It's during these times that I need to STOP and RE-FOCUS. I need to look to our God who loves us RELENTLESSLY. He knows what I need better than I do. I need to trust in His goodness and faithfulness and "get a grip" on gratitude. What a privilege it is to be able to walk with this awesome Creator, Savior, Shepherd, Redeemer-God while I'm still on this earthly journey! I am so blessed!!
