Gail's first vocation was teaching German at the University of Miami for 8 years. She continued teaching Adult Education for another 15 years.

In 1980 Gail moved to Chico CA, with her son Paul (19 months old) where she managed a medical office for 15 years.

While there, she visited Faith American Lutheran Church and never left. Pastor Carl told her for years, that she was "underemployed" at the medical clinic and she needed to go to seminary. In 1993, this was three times confirmed by Pastor Don at a funeral luncheon. Gail, as a lay leader, had presided over the funeral service because no clergy were available.

Gail attended seminary at Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary. Her first call was in Green Bay, and it lasted for 10 years. Then she was called to St. John in Edgar, Wisconsin where she has served for 15 years.

We are so glad that God directed her steps to include Pastoring in Edgar, Wisconsin!


